

ED Management of Pregnant Patient greater than 16 weeks gestation

16 weeks gestation or greater
Fetal heart tones required
FHT = 110-160 over one minute

Yes

OB Complaint/Significant

No

Consultation with OB on call or
patient's Obstetrician

No

- No labs required
- Counseling symptoms for abruption, if needed
- Radiology or other studies if needed
- If discharged from ED, in basket or phone message to OB to alert of ED visit

Yes

Trauma

- Significant impact direct to abdomen or buttock
- MC-low impact with or without injury
- Domestic or other violence

Pack pain or abdominal pain

Bleeding

Cramping/uterine contractions

Leaking of fluid

Severe headache/visual changes

Decreased fetal movement

Pelvic pressure

Cervical dilatation ≥ 1 cm or effacement $\geq 50\%$ or rupture of membranes or membrane visible via speculum exam

Hypertension $> 135/85$ in the absence of known history

Other serious medical conditions e.g. sepsis, seizure, hypotension, respiratory difficulty

GBH, SK, EH contact L&D at EH for
consultation/monitoring/admission
HPH, contact LDRP for
consultation/monitoring/admission
