- Course Description: This emergency medicine fellowship module will include the indication, contraindications, instruction, demonstration, and return demonstration of common urgent care procedures. Special considerations applicable to certain patient populations including children and the elderly will be included. This course will provide supervised experiences in the Sim Lab and in the clinical area.
- Course Outcomes:
1. Interpret extremity x-rays for basic fractures in adults
 2. Correctly apply a splint to upper and lower extremities for given injuries
 3. Demonstrate beginning proficiency in suturing, including simple interrupted, running, and mattress
 4. Demonstrate correct performance of procedures including but not limited to:
I & D, paronychia, reduction of digits of upper and lower extremities, removal of jewelry/rings, and FB removal from soft tissue, & I eye, ear, and nose
 5. Demonstrate use of bedside sonography for abscess and foreign body removal
 6. Demonstrate anterior and posterior control of epistaxis
 7. Demonstrate proper use of slit lamp
 8. Demonstrate Woods lamp exam
 9. Demonstrate performance of a speculum and bimanual pelvic exam
 10. Demonstrate arthrocentesis of knee
 11. Correctly interpret given 12 lead EKGs
- Teaching methods: Didactic lectures/discussions, case studies, assigned readings, and other materials as assigned. Participation in simulation and other lab experiences. Precepted clinical hours.
- Evaluation: 1. Weekly meeting with Fellowship Director to include discussion of exemplar case from clinical experiences

2. Simulation case study with evaluation
3. Evaluation of clinical preceptor
4. Evaluation of clinical procedures log
