Course Description:	This emergency medicine fellowship module will include an emphasis on conditions presenting to the ED related to the head, eye, ear, nose and throat. These conditions will include selected traumatic injuries, infectious, and inflammatory conditions, as well as foreign bodies, and dental conditions. The assessment, diagnosis and ED treatment will be presented with an emphasis on specialty consultation and referral. There will be a focus on special considerations applicable to certain patient populations including children and the elderly. This module will provide practice and supervision in the performance of interpretation of selected diagnostics and interventions.
Course Outcomes:	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Perform a complete ophthalmologic examination including a slit lamp exam when appropriate for patients presenting with eye complaints2. Identify and intervene appropriately for patients who present to the ED with the potential for airway compromise due to an infectious or inflammatory condition.3. Demonstrate appropriate management of epistaxis including anterior and posterior bleeds.4. Perform selected invasive and non-invasive procedures in the assessment and treatment of patients with HEENT complaints. Procedures include but are not limited to peritonsillar abscess aspiration, foreign body removal from eye, ear, and nose, and dental blocks5. Choose antibiotic use in accordance with guidelines and individual patient presentation
Teaching methods:	Didactic lectures/discussions, case studies, assigned readings, and other materials as assigned. Participation in simulation and other lab experiences. Precepted clinical hours.

Evaluation:

1. Weekly meeting with fellowship director to include discussion of exemplar case from clinical experiences
2. Simulation case study with evaluation
3. Evaluation of clinical preceptor
4. Evaluation of clinical procedures log
