Course Description: This emergency medicine fellowship module will present content and skills related to women's health conditions seen in the ED. These conditions will include infectious, selected traumatic injuries, inflammatory and other conditions in the pregnant or non-pregnant female patient. The current guidelines for the diagnosis and treatment of STIs will be presented. Focused assessment and management of sexual assault will be presented by a forensic/SANE presenter. Special considerations applicable to certain patient populations including children and the elderly will be presented. Precipitous birth in the ED will be reviewed.

Course Outcomes:

1. Identify and manage potentially serious gynecologic infections and non infectious conditions presenting to the ED
2. Demonstrate the appropriate diagnostic evaluation for the pregnant patient with vaginal bleeding
3. Demonstrate the complete assessment, examination, documentation, and management of a sexual assault patient
4. Interpret diagnostic studies correctly, such as US and CT scans during the evaluation of patients with OB/GYNE complaints

Teaching methods: Didactic lectures/discussions, case studies, assigned readings, and other materials as assigned. Participation in simulation and other lab experiences. Precepted clinical hours.

Evaluation:

1. Weekly meeting with fellowship director to include discussion of exemplar case from clinical experiences
2. Simulation case study with evaluation
3. Evaluation of clinical preceptor
4. Evaluation of clinical procedures log
