Course Description:	This emergency medicine fellowship module will outline common drugs used in psychological treatment of patients in the ED. It will also review the concept and management of polypharmacy
Course Outcomes:	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Describe commonly used drugs in ED for conditions pertaining to each unit (ex: cardiology, HEENT, endocrine, etc)2. Identify patients with polypharmacy use3. Manage patient care plans with polypharmacy, young and geriatric4. List common psychiatric drugs seen and used in ED5. Choose appropriate drug(s) for patient in acute psychological distress
Teaching methods:	Didactic lectures/discussions, case studies, assigned readings, and other materials as assigned. Participation in simulation and other lab experiences. Precepted clinical hours.
